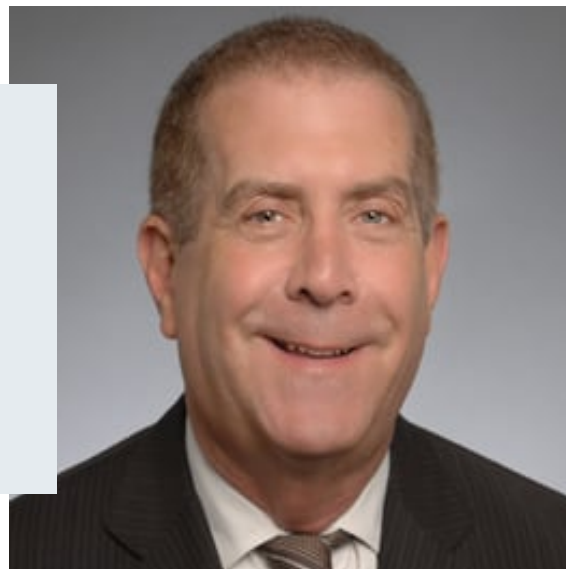


**Richard M. Albert**
