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Richard G. Stoll is a partner in the Washington, D.C. and Milwaukee, WI offices of Foley & Lardner LLP where he concentrates his practice on federal administrative and environmental law matters. Richard has been practicing environmental and administrative law since the 1970s, when he joined the EPA Office of General Counsel. He was involved in the development of regulations under the Clean Air and Water Acts and RCRA, and with the interpretation and application of those rules. Upon leaving the EPA, Richard was for three years deputy general counsel of the Chemical Manufacturers Association (now the American Chemistry Council).
